Garden Tour 2013 A Resounding Success!

Petaluma was the place to be on Friday and Saturday, May 17 and 18, with the beauty and diversity of six gardens on display for our 22nd annual Garden Tour. This year had a lot of "firsts" and changes to previous procedures and customs. We had never had a Tour in Petaluma before, and it appeared to draw some new people from the town as well as Marin County, and our faithful attendees for years seemed for the most part to enjoy exploring new territory! Preliminary estimates put our attendance greater than last year, possibly 1,100. Our garden hosts were all the sole creators and maintainers of their gardens, and as a group were wholeheartedly invested in the Tour - present in their gardens for both days receiving guests, answering questions, and even offering plant cuttings! Attendees really appreciated the inspiration and ideas from "hands on" gardens of all sizes.

Due to a smaller Garden Tour committee, with some members not even present for GT weekend due to out of town commitments, at times we were stretched fairly thin. Even so, thanks to the dedicated individuals involved we had our invitations and program, a beautiful painting for the art raffle, a robust wine and dine raffle offering, delightful music from the young musicians, and raised a record sponsorship amount of \$40,000 and net proceeds of \$54,000! On Tour days we had less directional signs and less staffing in the gardens, and it all worked out just fine. (One gentleman was actually overheard expressing great relief that he was not constantly being reminded "watch your step!" at every irregularity of terrain.)

Megan Mullin, 25 years old. Sophomore, Samuel Merritt University. Doctorate, Physical Therapy. \$2,000. This is the second year we have funded Megan. She has done well this first year of a three year Doctorate program.

Safe Schools Program

Letter from Aracely Romo-Flores, Principal, Biella Elementary School Santa Rosa, CA

I would just like to thank you all

for the \$1000 mini-grant you provided Albert F. Biella Elementary School to help us fund the Toolbox Project, a social and emotional learning curriculum for elementary school children. As a result of your generous contribution we have been able to train our students, teachers, and families in how to use these tools to help us cope with difficult situations and to build resiliency.

One of the 12 tools we introduced is the "breathing tool" and an interesting thing occurred as a result. When the third grade teachers came together to review student assessment results earlier this school year, they noticed that the scores of approximately IO students across the three classes were inconsistent with their classroom performance. The teachers thought that perhaps these students were under the weather when given the test and/or suffer from test anxiety. Consequently, we brought those students in to an alternate setting to retest them. We told them that we believed they could do better than the score on the previous test indicated, and then led them to use their "breathing tool" to help them relax and be better prepared to do their best. Well, not only did these students do better, but they surpassed our expectations!

Over and over again, we have witnessed students use these tools to help them cope and deal with situations in a healthy manner. We can't thank you enough for providing the needed funding to bring this wonderful program to our students and their families.
